- Create a database (Users' Guide 4.0 pages 9-10)
 Open CPS from desktop icon > Create a New CPS File > OK > (name it) > Save
- 2. Create a file on the server/m: drive called CPS Files (to be used later if you transfer a database from one computer to another).
- 3. Create a class of students (Users' Guide page 80)
 Open CPS from desktop > Classes tab > New > K-12 > next > no > next > (fill required fields) > Class Name (use "Grade #") > next > done
 - and add students (Users' Guide pages 86-87)

 Open CPS from desktop > Classes tab > (select the class) > New (with + and student icon) > (use fields at bottom of screen) > save
- 4. Create a hierarchy of the files you want to use to organize your lessons (Users' Guide page 17)

Lessons tab > (highlight where you want to put the file) > (right click or Tools > New > Lesson > (name it) > OK

- 5. Create a lesson Types:
 - a) Verbal (Users' Guide pages 152-154)

Open CPS from desktop > Lessons tab > Verbal Questions > Verbal > (choose question type) > start

b) Fast Grade (Users' Guide pages 18-19)

Open CPS from desktop > Lessons tab > (highlight where you want to put the lesson > (right click or Tools) > Fast Grade > (name it) > OK > (select correct answer button for the first question under the type of question template you want - CPS automatically moves to the next question) > (continue inputting correct answers) > OK (when all done)

c) A Lesson with Your Own Questions (Users' Guide pages 19-20)

Open CPS from desktop > (highlight where you want to put the lesson) > (right click or Tools) > New > Lesson > (name it) > OK > (highlight this lesson) > (right click or Tools) > New > Question > (can choose question template) > (type question) > (type answers) > (select the correct answer) > (click floppy disk icon to save and move ahead) > Question > Save > Close

d) Import Exam View (Users' Guide pages 53-54) - You may not edit the questions of an imported Exam View lesson in CPS. The first time you do this you will be asked to choose your state from a pull-down menu.

Open CPS from desktop > Lessons tab > (right click Exam View folder) > Add file > (browse until you find the Exam View file you want to import) > Open

e) Import a PowerPoint (Users' Guide page 54)

Open CPS from desktop > Lessons tab > (right click the PowerPoint folder) > Add File > (browse until you find

the PowerPoint presentation you want to import) > Open

f) Import from Microsoft Word (Users' Guide pages 50-52) Questions must be RTF-formatted in order for them to be imported.

Open Word file > File > Save as (see p. 51-2 of User Guide for details of how to format question and answer stems before importing to CPS) > Save as type > Rich Text Format (*rtf) > Open CPS from desktop > Lessons tab > Tools > Import... > Browse > Look in: (to view the folder your file is in) > Files of Type: (to view RTF files) > Open

- 6. Engaging Lessons, Fast Grade, Exam View, Verbal Questions (Users' Guide pages 148-149, 151-154) Open CPS from desktop > Lessons tab > (select lesson to deliver) > Engage Lesson > Start > Next (#1) > Start > End
- 7. Reports (Users' Guide pages 176-178) There are many types of reports. We're sharing three that we feel are useful. You may want to see what else is available that appeals to you.
 - a) Study Guide Report
 - b) Study Guide Incorrect Answers Report
 - c) Question Grid Export Report

Open CPS from desktop > Reports tab > (select session) > Generate > (select students on whom you want to generate a report) > (select report type) > Preview > (choose Output) > (choose print source) > Close

8. Charting (Users' Guide pages 182-184)

Open CPS from desktop > Reports tab > (select session) > charting > Options > Chart Response by.../Chart Type ... > (to print: Reports > Print Chart)

You may also view charts <u>during</u> a session by clicking on the Charting icon.

 - a) There It Is!
 - b) CPS Challenge Board*
 - c) Top Score

*To <u>create</u> a Challenge Board, you will use questions that **already** exist in your Lessons:

Open CPS from desktop > Team Activities tab > Challenge icon > New icon > (give it a title and name the categories - you may edit these later) > OK > (select lesson in top left box where questions you want to use are located - they will appear at the bottom) > (highlight the questions you want - use Ctrl key to select multiple, non-consecutive questions - and drag it to the correct category and point value -the number of questions for that point value increases by one) > (you may click on a category's point value to see all of the questions and to do some deleting if necessary) > x out to close

To **edit** a Challenge Board at a later date:

Open CPS from desktop > Team Activities tab > Challenge icon > (select the Challenge Board you wish to edit) > Edit icon > (to change category names: File > Edit Challenge Board attributes > OK) OR (can add questions as you did above)

To <u>engage</u> a CPS Challenge Board - you may put children into teams with one IR pad per team or children can compete individually:

Open CPS from desktop > Team Activities tab > Challenge icon > (select the Challenge Board you want to use) > Engage icon

(under Settings you have the option of showing the score at the center of the board or not)
(click Student if you want to randomly select a student for a category and point value)
> (click on category's point value) > Start > End > Close
(to get back to the Challenge Board - repeat the process) > (when Challenge Board is completed:) File > Close (performance data is on Records tab)
